### Visit to Lowther Castle, Saturday 29th June

On the hottest day of the year so far twenty-four people took the coach trip to Lowther Castle <a href="https://www.lowthercastle.org/">https://www.lowthercastle.org/</a>. Those who had been on our previous trip in 2015 marvelled at how the parterre on the south terrace, the wild flower meadows now occupying the entire east and west sides of the long south lawn, and many other areas had matured. The small team of four full-time gardeners supported by volunteers has achieved so much. With the completion of work to stabilize the roofless central tower of the castle we were able to enjoy some recent planting in very shaded areas inside the structure and hear of the Head Gardener's plans for a fernery in the former stately main entrance hall!

Planting out of a new rose garden has begun with hundreds of David Austin English roses and thousands of low-growing perennials. There was plenty of time to explore other areas of the huge site and a personal favourite was Jack Croft's Pond and Summerhouse – a designated silent area, enhanced by the reflections

of trees and shrubs in the water which was edged by yellow flag irises coming into flower. Perhaps the only negative feature of all the newly planted areas was the total lack of plant labelling – some plant combinations were visually stunning but it required a very detailed knowledge of varieties to identify how this effect had been achieved.

### Plants 'n' Pimms at Green Meadow, Friday 26th July

### Visit to Arley Hall, Northwich, Tuesday 20th August

The weather was kind and thirty-one people enjoyed the gardens, eating in the Gardener's Kitchen, buying from the Plant Nursery, and some visited the Hall and Chapel as well. A wide variety of crocosmia were in spectacular flower and many planting combinations provided stunning effects, especially in front of the Hall.





The double herbaceous border was created in 1846 and is believed to be one of the first of its kind in England; the 'period' Alcove provides a place to sit and enjoy the vista. The borders featured a wide variety of seasonal favourites such as crocosmia, echinacea, echinops, kniphofia, rudbeckia and sedum.
