PAST EVENTS

GrowOrganic - bulk order and distribution Saturday 23rd March

Our supplier failed to send all the merchandise ordered in the first delivery. Ten days later the remainder was supplied and delivered to members on Tuesday 2nd April. We apologise to those of you who did not receive your order on 23rd March but it was due to circumstances beyond our control.

Visit to RHS Garden Bridgewater, Monday 8th April

Perfect spring weather shone on the twenty people who toured the site of RHS Garden Bridgewater being created in the grounds of Worsley Hall. The Hall was built between 1840 and 1845 but demolished in 1949. The gardens have not been cultivated since 1914 and at various times over the next one hundred years parts were used as a nursery and garden centre, scout camp and rifle range. The RHS acquired a long lease of the site in 2015 and has held a number of open competitions for the design of different areas. The idea is not to re-create the gardens as they were in the 19th century but to create gardens for today and tomorrow. The result is some exciting and original design ideas, most of which have barely started to take shape on the ground. Highlights of the two-hour tour were the large lake, recently drained and de-silted (the left-hand photo shows some of our group negotiating the slope above it).





Extensive woodlands have been cleared of the invasive rhododendron ponticum. Three enormous walled gardens have been cleared of undergrowth, including a row of 60ft high *Leylandii* heeled-in as cuttings for sale when the site was a nursery over thirty years ago. One walled garden is being made into a Paradise Garden with water features (see right-hand photo above), another into a vegetable and fruit garden and the third into a Well-Being Garden with community allotments close by. Historic varieties of twenty-three pear and two apple trees have been identified in the former wildernesses and four hundred cuttings taken to create a modern orchard. Phase three of the renovation (dependent on finance and not due for completion for more than ten years) will see the creation of an arboretum and the foundations of the Hall used as the base for a conservatory on a similar scale to that at Kew Gardens. The tour whetted the appetites of all to return to the

site in 2020 when the £32m first phase opens to the public, to see how the present construction site has become a place of horticultural inspiration, information and education.
