

Volunteer Work Parties – July and August 2014

The Morecambe Bay Nature Improvement Area needs you to help us to improve the habitat for Morecambe Bay's special species! We'll be working with our partners – Butterfly Conservation, Cumbria Wildlife Trust, Lancashire Wildlife Trust, National Trust, and RSPB over the coming months, and would love to see you join us.

Thursday 3rd July: Grassland Management – Grubbins Wood, Arnside

Join us at Cumbria Wildlife Trust's Grubbins Wood reserve to pull thistles on docks on this limestone grassland site overlooking the Bay at Arnside.

Meet at Grubbins Wood, Arnside. Grid ref: SD446 780. Limited parking on shore.

Thursday 17th July: Grassland Management – Levens

Come and join us at Lane End Farm, Levens to pull ragwort and collect wildflower seeds to help restore grassland.

Meet at Heaves Dairy, Levens. Grid ref: SD491 866. Parking space for 6 cars in laybys adjacent to the Dairy.

Thursday 31st July: Grassland Management – Holme Stinted Pasture

Join us at this marvellous grassland site to help manage bracken for some of our most threatened butterflies.

Meet at Clawthorpe Lane. Grid ref: SD 54535 78421. Parking in lay-by.

Thursday 7th August: Reed Bed Creation – Brigsteer

Join us at this flagship National Trust wetland re-creation project at Park End Farm, Brigsteer when we will be planting out common reed (*Phragmites australis*) plugs.

Meet at Brigsteer Wood. Grid ref: SD 485 886.

Thursday 14th August: Limestone and Meadow Restoration – Brigsteer

Two sessions 10 – 2pm and 4pm – 8pm. Join us on this National Trust site to help us plant wildflower plugs to restore limestone grassland and meadow at Park End Farm, Brigsteer.

Meet at Brigsteer Wood. Grid ref: SD 485 886. Parking in layby inside the Wood.

Thursday 21st August: Grassland Management – Arnside

Join us and the National Trust to help keep their grassland around Arnside Knott in great condition.

Meet at Arnside Knott Car Park. Grid ref: SD 450 774.

Days typically start at 10am and finish no later than 4pm – see individual listings for more details.

What do I need to bring? You'll need appropriate outdoor clothing, including waterproofs, and stout footwear. You should also bring a packed lunch and a drink. Please be aware a number of these sites have a problem with ticks.

How much does it cost? All our days are completely free of charge.

Do I need to book? We normally operate on a no-need-to-book basis. We will need some basic emergency contact information; you will then be covered by insurance.
